Dean Health Plan Medical Policy:

- 1.0 An ambulatory event cardiac monitor **does not** require prior authorization and is considered medically necessary for the detection of cardiac arrhythmias when **ANY** of the following devices are to be used:
 - 1.1 Holter monitor
 - 1.2 Patch cardiac rhythm monitor (e.g., ZIO Patch)
 - 1.3 External loop recorder (ELR)/external intermittent cardiac event monitor
- 2.0 Implantable loop cardiac recorder (cardiac event monitor) does not require prior authorization and is considered medically necessary for ANY of the following indications:
 - 2.1 Unexplained symptoms suggestive of cardiac arrhythmias (e.g., unexplained syncope, presyncope palpitations or dizziness)
 - 2.2 Post-cardiac ablation monitoring
 - 2.3 History of cryptogenic stroke or transient ischemia attack (TIA) with suspected unconfirmed occult atrial fibrillation.
- 3.0 Implantable loop cardiac records for any other indications are considered **experimental and investigational**, and therefore not medically necessary.
